ISSI kicks off the new year with strategic planning and target setting

It was the first week of the New Year and the whole nstitute went off to a fresh beginning with UP ISSI Director Melanie Moraga-Leaño spearheading the Strategic Planning and Target Setting's two-day event to achieve the desired outcomes for 2023 and beyond.

The first day of the strategic planning started with the opening remarks of Dir. Leaño and the accomplishment reports of the five divisions.



Ms. Nadine Mislan, head of the Administrative Delivery Division (ADD), summarized her division's achievement for last year. She noted the help of the newly hired staff that made the distribution of work quite easier and the creation of databases for easy filing and retrieval of documents.

Meanwhile, Mr. Reynold Ferdinand Manegdeg, head of the Business Enterprise Development Division (BEDD), reported the projects done by the division, specifically the completed Science for the Convergence of Agriculture and Tourism (SciCAT) project, a collaborative project with the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-PCAARRD) and the Institute. Together with Messrs Karen Kaye Bravo-Coballes, Marsha Lee Delfinado, and Ma. Luisa Solarte-Lee, Manegdeg detailed the BEDD's ongoing and forthcoming projects for this year.

The Research Division (RD), on the other hand, reported their achievements, specifically the research and publications of guidebooks and smart guides. The division's "crowning glory," was the publication of their research on women entrepreneurs. Ms. Berna Escoto did the report on behalf of the RD head, Dr. Ian Jester De Vera, who was in quarantine during the presentation.

Engr. Rolando Ramon Diaz, head of the Training and Entrepreneurship Education Division (TEED), reported on the works finished by his Division. He mentioned the 38 webinars (from July 2020 up to December 2022), with a total of 3,727 attendance—72% of these were MSMEs.

The Director's Office (DO) reported last with Dir. Leaño stating the posting of the Annual Report and the two newsletters last year. She also mentioned the technical support for the website, digital marketing, and the digitization of all resources in the library as DO's achievement.

A two hour seminar on the crafting of the Office Performance Commitment and Review (OPCR) by the representatives from the UP Human Resource Development Office (HRDO) followed up with Mr. Rogelio Estrada, division chief of HRDO's planning and research division and Ms. Glenda Glodoveza, section chief of the monitoring and evaluation. The OPCR was added to the strat plan to guide all the divisions of ISSI in the alignment of their targets vis-à-vis with the University's mandate.

The afternoon session was the review of vision and mission as well as the review of the current organization structure and directions for 2023. Dir. Leaño also mentioned the institutional plans and projects for the year and the introduction of several committees that all staff should have signed on for membership. The actual crafting of the OPCR and the target setting for each division came up next and the synthesis of the day's event by Mr. Jefferson Sumalabe ended the first day of the two-day strategic planning.

The second day started with TEED's energizer and last part of the OPCR workshop and target setting. The culminating activity, the presentation of targets for 2023 by all the divisions followed before the lunch break.



The afternoon session came up with the open forum and the synthesis of the day's activities by Ms. Joanna Rose Laddaran while the closing remark was given by Dir. Leaño to end the program.

"Let us have a culture of appreciation and let us contribute to the institution for all our common good," Dir. Leaño quipped to sum up the successful January 5-6 event.

The UP ISSI Team composed of Dir. Melanie Moraga-Leaño, University Extension Specialists Joanna Rose Laddaran, Allysa Anne Mari-De Guzman, Melanie Cabotaje, and Ron Allan Estrebillo presented the various programs and research studies of the Institute focusing on disaster resilience and business continuity of the MSME sector.

Ron Allan R. Estrebillo, of the Training and Entrepreneurship Education Division, delivered "HANDA: Building Towards Resilient and Sustainable MSMEs in the Philippines" while UP ISSI Director Melanie M. Moraga-Leaño did her flash talk presentation "Marginalized Identities during Health Disasters: Impacts of the COVID-19 Pandemic on Women in the Informal Economy", highlighting the results of the research study entitled, "Impacts of the COVID-19 Pandemic on Women in the Informal Economy in Quezon City" conducted by the UP ISSI Research Division in 2021.

Meanwhile, COPE Program Manager, Allysa Anne M. De Guzman, showcased "COPE Program: Promoting a Culture of Resilience among MSMEs in the Midst of a Crisis." The Community of Practice for Entrepreneurship (COPE) Program is an advocacy project of the Training and Entrepreneurship Education Division of Institute that aims to bring entrepreneurship education to the people most especially the communities that have less opportunities to access such social service through formal education.

On the other hand, Melanie V. Cabotaje, from "Local Research Division, presented Government Response for MSMEs during Health Disasters: A Tale of Two Cities" and finally, UP ISSI HANDA Program Focal Person, Joanna Rose T. Laddaran, delivered "The Road to Sustainable Recovery through Business Continuity: Stories of Philippine MSMEs Dealing with Compound Disasters." Her presentation was based on the research study funded by the UP Diliman Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research Development through its Outright Research Grant.

UP ISSI returns to face-to-face implementation of regular training programs

After three years of online modality, the University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries commenced 2023 with four regular programs returning to face-to-face setup in January and February. The 126th Manager Course (MC) opened last January 28, while the 63rd Accounting for Non-Accountants (AfNA), 73rd Productivity through Effective Supervision (PES), and 8th Digital Marketing Course (DMC) simultaneously started on February 11.

Due to the COVID-19 from 2020 to 2022, the UP ISSI's Training and Entrepreneurship Education Division (TEED) transitioned the conduct of its regular training programs to online platforms. This helped the institute to adapt and serve its clients despite the challenging period.

But with the easing of pandemic restrictions at the end of 2022, the institute decided to return to face-to-face implementation of majority of its training programs for the year 2023.

In addition, the institute will still be offering online and hybrid training programs to accommodate clients who prefer this mode and those who face limitations like distance and location.

UP ISSI takes part in the 2023 Conference Workshop on Indigenous Languages and the Sustainable Development Goals

Ms. Nova Z. Navo and Ms. Danica Pacardo presented the paper "Systematic Literature Review of Digital Technology Adoption of Women Entrepreneurs" at the Conference Workshop on Indigenous Languages and the Sustainable Development Goals held at the University of the Philippines Visayas Auditorium in Iloilo City last February 21–23, 2023.

The paper, which Ms. Navo and Ms. Pacardo coauthored with Dr. Ian Jester De Vera and Ms. Melanie Cabotaje, sought to understand how women entrepreneurs adopt digital technology for their businesses.

Using the systematic literature review approach, the writers identified and analyzed a total of 63 academic articles in English using the Scopus and Web of Science electronic databases.

The paper focused on five main discussion points, namely: (1) how women in general use digital technology, (2) the impact of its use on women, (3) the extent of participation of women in the development of IT, (4) how women entrepreneurs use digital technology, and (5) factors influencing women entrepreneurs to adopt digital technology. Gender equality in digital technology adoption is a relatively recent and developing concept, and the systematic review revealed that discussions on the topic were scarce and need to be expanded.

The Conference explored the intersections of the Four Outcomes of the International Decade of Indigenous Languages (IDIL) 2022-2032 Global Action Plan and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as underlined in the 2030 Agenda. These are No Poverty, Zero Hunger, Good Health and Well-Being, and Quality Education.

Likewise, the conference provided the platform for key stakeholders to begin the process of a strategic national response to the Four Outcomes envisioned in the Global Action Plan of the IDIL 2022-2032, in alignment to the SDGs, and the various national, regional, sectoral and agency, and local development goals.

The paper presented by ISSI staff fell under three cross-cutting themes: Media and Digital Empowerment, Economy and Equitable Growth, and Gender and Safe Spaces.

The event was organized by Talaytayan Multilingual Education, Inc., the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), the TEBTEBBA (Indigenous Peoples' International Centre for Policy Research and Education) Foundation Inc., and the University of the Philippines – Visayas.

COPE Webinar highlights productivity among MSMEs

The second episode of Communities of Practice for Entrepreneurship (COPE) Webinar series of the University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries (UP ISSI) featured discussions on promoting productivity among MSMEs last Feb. 3 via zoom and Facebook live.

Prof. Melanie M. Moraga-Leaño, Director of UP ISSI, emphasized in the opening ceremony that the MSME sector is a key player in the road to economic recovery of the country and that productivity must be promoted among MSMEs to help them from the challenges brought by the pandemic.

"Bukas na muli ang mundo kaya very timely ang pag-uusapan ngayon on productivty," said Prof. Moraga-Leaño.

Dr. Felix C. Veroya of Ask Lex PH Academy shared the best practices in managing productivity for MSMEs in the 'next normal'.

"If we are conscious enough, aware enough, that knowing productivity, how we manage and improve it, we can better utilize the resources," Dr. Veroya said.

He also added emphasized the benefits of having opportunities on training and development and how these will directly improve one's level of productivity.

Moreover, Mr. Reynold Ferdinand G. Manegdeg, head of the Business Enterprise Development Division of UP ISSI, discussed the importance of talent development as an Asian Productivity Organization productivity framework.

"Maraming HR (Human Resouce) leaders ang worried sa work fatigue," Mr. Manegdeg stated during his sharing on the Job Redesign methods.

He explained how work friction affects the productivity of the people in workplaces and shared practical techniques in improving labor productivity.

He also shared the SGPC 4D Job Redesign Methodology where he pointed out that 'discover' and 'define' are the most challenging ones in this model.

COPE aims to promote entrepreneurship education by knowledge exchange among MSME owners, government agencies, and private organizations engaged in MSME development.

Helping MSMEs Survive and Thrive in the New Normal

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought unprecedented challenges to the local economy, with MSMEs bearing the brunt of its impact. With limited resources and high susceptibility to economic shocks, many MSMEs have struggled to maintain their operations and adapt to the new normal. To help address this pressing issue, UP ISSI in July 2022 has launched the Gain Advancement through Business Advisory and Support Service (GABAy) Program, an initiative designed to assist and guide MSMEs in developing pivotal strategies to effectively adjust during these difficult times.

GABAy is UP ISSI's flagship advocacy program that aims to accelerate the growth and sustainability of MSMEs by providing online mentoring and online marketing support. It offers a comprehensive range of services to support MSMEs, including enterprise counseling (online and face-to-face) and online marketing support, for enhanced productivity and efficiency. Under this program, entrepreneurs can receive personalized advice to diagnose and resolve their operational issues. The program also assists MSMEs in the development of marketing collaterals and articles, business planning and networking.

While GABAy mainly caters to MSMEs, it also offers guidance to government and non-government organizations engaged in enterprise development. Last year, UP ISSI has forged collaborations with Agri-Aqua Technology Business Incubation (ATBI) programs at five (5) State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) across the country. The involved SUCs are Cavite State University (Indang, Cavite), Central Mindanao University (Maramag, Bukidnon), Sultan Kudarat State University (Tacurong City, Sultan Kudarat), Don Mariano Marcos Memorial State University (Sto. Tomas, La Union), and Benguet State University (La Trinidad, Benguet).

Agri Technologies Up for Grabs:

Matching Innovative Enterprises with the Industry

The Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI) spearheaded the "Agri Technologies Up for Grabs," a round table discussion and business matching activity for the first batch of beneficiaries of the LIPAD Project on February 28, 2023. The event was conducted at the BA Securities Hall located in the PCCI Building in Taguig City, and online through Zoom.

The activity was co-organized by UP ISSI and the Department of Science and Technology Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST PCAARRD). It showcased the products of the seven LIPAD startups that were also the first recipients of the DOST PCAARRD Startup Grant Fund.

LIPAD, which stands for "Levelling up of Innovative Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources-based Startups/Spin-offs through Promotion, Assistance Development," is a collaborative project between the DOST PCAARRD and UP ISSI. It aims to provide support and assistance Agriculture, Aquatic and Resources (AANR)-based enterprises by offering commercialization capability building, mentorship, business matching services.

It aims to provide support and assistance to Agriculture, Natural Aquatic and (AANR)-based Resources by offering enterprises commercialization support, capability building, mentorship, and business matching services.

The event was formally opened by Mr. George T. Barcelon, President of the PCCI. He highlighted that the event provided an excellent platform for the startups to showcase their innovations and receive feedback from the industry.

This feedback could be valuable in helping the startups improve their products, and potentially lead to their growth and success.

The keynote speaker, Mr. Noel A. Catibog, Director of the Technology Transfer and Promotion Division of the DOST PCAARRD, expressed his excitement for the first batch of startup grantees and their innovations. He stated that the DOST PCAARRD is intent on helping **Filipinos** through research and development efforts.

However, he emphasized that these efforts are all for naught innovations the overlooked. That is why Mr. Catibog expressed gratitude towards PCCI for connecting LIPAD the enterprises with the industry. He encouraged everyone to technologies startup serve the people.

During the event, each startup was allocated a total of five minutes to present their pitch deck to the audience. The allotted time allowed the startups to deliver concise and informative presentations and capture the attention of their target partners.

Here is a brief summary of the LIPAD enterprises, along with their product offerings and the business partners they are seeking:

Fullmight Agricultural Corp. – produces Nutrio, a microbial-based biofertilizer for sugarcane and other crops. The enterprise is seeking distributors in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao, as well as client farmers, as business partners.

Elbitech Inc. – offers **Acticon**, a biocontrol solution against the Panama disease that infects bananas. The enterprise is seeking investors and a national distributor as business partners.

Algacon Aquafeeds Manufacturing – produces Juan Algae, a ready-to-use, chemical-free, and eco-friendly microalgae paste instant feed that can be a substitute for on-site algal culture. The enterprise is seeking nursery and fishpond operators, and national government agencies as business partners.

Blitzkrieg Animal Diagnostic Center – manufactures Andali Rapid Test Kits that detect various transboundary animal diseases and viral antigens in swine, livestock and poultry. The enterprise is seeking provincial distributors as business partners.

BDOZ Veterinary Products – offers BDOZ Betel Nut Dewormer, an organic poultry anthelmintic made from locally-sourced natural ingredients that can reduce and eliminate intestinal worms in chickens. The enterprise is seeking poultry associations and distributors as business partners.

Verabella Enterprises Limited Co. – produces Daerrys Tilapia Ice Cream and Cookies, a healthy alternative to traditional sweet treats with high protein and zero preservative content. The enterprise is seeking distributors and resellers as business partners.

Agricom Best Foods Corp. – offers ChevLamb, a high-protein, low-fat chevon dish available in a can or vacuum pack. It is made from tender cuts of goat meat and is offered in three local flavors – kaldereta, kilawin, and adobo. The enterprise is seeking contract growers and distributors as business partners.

The Round Table Discussion was concluded by Prof. Melanie M. Moraga-Leaño, Director of the UP ISSI. She expressed her appreciation for the synergy among diverse organizations during the event. She stressed the importance of seeing things from multiple perspectives to establish and maintain good relationships, which is essential in achieving success.

Prof. Leaño thanked the PCCI, the DOST PCAARRD, the UP ISSI LIPAD Project Management headed by Ms. Marsha Lee A. Delfinado for making the event possible. She congratulated the LIPAD grantees for their successful pitches and reminded them of the importance of taking feedback into account for future opportunities.

After the round table discussion, the business matching session was held at the PCCI Boardroom, providing an opportunity for the seven participating enterprises to meet with potential partners and collaborators. Among those who expressed interest and made inquiries were potential investors, distributors, resellers, marketers, and network representatives.

Before the session started, UP ISSI employees shared the highlights of their small group discussions which highlighted their existing knowledge on different forms of sexual harassment. Relevant concepts such as power relations, consent, violation, boundaries, sexism, and inappropriate touching were mentioned during their presentations.

In celebration of the National Women's Month, the University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries Gender and Development committee spearheaded a learning session on promoting anti-sexual harassment in the workplace on March 21, 2023 at Rm. 300 of UP ISSI building.

Ms. Janet E. De Leon, University Extension Specialist I from the Office of the Anti-Sexual Harassment (OASH) led the discussion and shared her insights on the topic.

Ms. De Leon's lecture covered relevant topics including UP Anti-Sexual Harassment Code, forms of sexual harassment, procedures on filing cases, the Safe Spaces Act, and the Civil Service

University Extension Specialists Ms. Danica Pacardo from the Research Division and Mx. Jake A. Villanueva from the Training and Entrepreneurship Education Division and Mx. Marvin "Marga" Manlapas, University Extension Associate from TEED represented the institute in the summit.

"The event was full of learning and is for everyone in the community especially the vulnerable and marginalized groups who need more visibility in the society, and I hope that through this, the government will join hands in being part of the solution towards an authentically Inclusive Philippines," said Mx. Manlapas.

The event aimed to raise awareness on the call for multi-sectoral inclusivity that will provide leaders and organizations in reviewing business cases including the politics of inclusion, and in crafting a brand identify of an inclusive Philippines.

"I take public transportation as a choice because I want to see how we are improving the services of the government to everybody; I line up minsan sa MRT, I line up minsan sa carousel sa bus, I experienced two-hour waiting time," started Ronn Astillas, Chair of Philippine LGBT Chamber of Commerce, during an interview about his inspiration in initiating the summit.

He also shared that his realizations during his experiences falling in line and riding public transportations triggered his desire to bring everyone and discuss what Inclusive Philippines should be about.

"Inclusive Philippines is not just LGBT inclusion; it's about the little people, people with disabilities, seniors and indigenous people. This has not been done in the past," Mr. Astillas added.

He emphasized that MSMEs will also benefit from this initiative because it will also give them more opportunities to talk and to engage policymakers that will support them.

The morning plenary focused on the foundations of economic exclusion and highlighted the goals, experiences, practices of the members of the panel including Maria Glorian "Toinkee" Tomen, Founder of Big Dreams for Little People – Philippines Inc., Marie Rose "Maroz" Ramos, Executive Director of GALANG Philippines, Gayle Antes, Co-founder of Sorbelato and Soyblessed, Carmen Zubiaga, President of WOW-LEAP, and Disney Aguila, former President of Pinoy Deaf Philippines. The session was moderated by advocate and artist Mae Paner.

DOST PCAARRD and the UP Institute for Small-Scale Industries (ISSI) successfully held the Startup Grant Annual Review Meeting at the UP University Hotel on February 27, 2023.

The Department of Science and Technology Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST PCAARRD) and UP ISSI recently held the Startup Grant Annual Review Meeting at the University Hotel in Diliman, Quezon City last Monday, February 27, 2023. The objective of the meeting was to review the accomplishments of the first batch of beneficiaries of the DOST PCAARRD Startup Grant Fund (SGF) and the LIPAD Project.

LIPAD, which stands for "Levelling up of Innovative Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources-based Startups/Spin-offs through Promotion, Assistance and Development," is a collaborative project of the DOST PCAARRD and UP ISSI. It aims to scale up Agri-Aqua and Natural Resources (AANR)-based enterprises through commercialization support, capability building & mentorship, and business matching.

The first batch of grantees consists of seven (7) startup/spinoff enterprises incubated under the Agri-Aqua Technology Incubators of state universities and colleges (SUCs), including the

Isabela State University, University of the Philippines Visayas, Capiz State University, Central Luzon State University, and University of the Philippines Los Banos.

During his opening statement, Director Noel A. Catibog of the DOST PCAARRD Technology Transfer and Promotion Division (TTPD) posed the question, "Tama ba ang desisyon ng DOST PCAARRD na magkaroon ng extra project suportahan ang ang mga startup tulad ninyo?" ("Was the DOST PCAARRD's decision to launch an extra project to support startups like yours a wise one?")

He continued by stating, "I am confident that UP ISSI will agree with me that we've made the right choice. With that, I express our sincerest gratitude for your effort, collaboration, and partnership with us." Additionally, he expressed his appreciation to UP ISSI and the LIPAD Project Management Team for their dependable support.

Regulatory compliance challenges

The challenge of regulatory compliance and barriers was identified as a significant issue facing startups, as highlighted by both the entrepreneurs and the project management team. This challenge was largely due to the fact that most of the grantees were still in the process of obtaining licenses from the relevant

regulatory bodies. Some of them even expressed confusion about the unclear guidelines that must be followed to secure their licenses. As a result, some of them faced obstacles in meeting their production targets and forging partnerships within the specified one-year project timeline.

Recognizing the challenges faced by the LIPAD enterprises, the DOST PCAARRD has stated their commitment to applying the lessons learned from the first batch of grantees to mitigate these issues for the second batch of beneficiaries.

UP ISSI, AIPO Support Filipino Inventor's Quest for Clean Water

The University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries (UP ISSI) and the Ateneo Intellectual Property Office (AIPO) are collaborating to support Filipino inventor and engineer, Ernesto Labuntog, in his quest for clean water. On Monday, April 3, the AIPO arranged a testing demonstration at the Marikina River to assess the efficacy of Labuntog's portable water treatment device and inventive pre-treatment process.

According to the inventor, this device together with the pre-treatment process can transform contaminated water into safe drinking water. This can be quite valuable not only during disaster situations but also at present as the country faces a water crisis.

The invention features an easy-to-use and inexpensive mechanism, eliminating the need for specialized skills or electricity during operation. It is able to produce clear potable water at a cost of under 2 pesos per liter, which is a lot more affordable than typical bottled water.

During the demonstration, the team collected water samples from the Marikina River, which exhibited visible signs of pollution such as murkiness and floating debris. Labuntog applied his specialized pre-treatment process and then used the device to treat the polluted water sample. Within just 30 minutes, it effectively transformed the murky water back into a clear state.

The AIPO submitted both the treated and untreated samples to the Department of Science and Technology – Industrial Technology Development Institute for further laboratory analysis.

Earlier in January, Labuntog sought the assistance of the UP ISSI and AIPO to help commercialize his invention. Since February, he has been receiving AIPO support through its Blue Nest incubation program. The AIPO, led by its director Dr. Proceso Fernandez Jr., along with Ms. May Ann Udtojan and Ms. Wilma Alamar, organized the testing demonstration in order to thoroughly validate Labuntog's invention.

The UP ISSI's Business Enterprise Development Division also took part in the activity, with Ms. Marsha Lee Delfinado and Mr. Uziel Guthrie Naguit providing valuable assistance.

This activity marks а significant journey milestone the in towards commercializing Labuntog's invention. It raises hopes for better access to clean drinking water, especially in plagued by pollution and water scarcity, both within the country and around the world.

Labuntog is a member of the Filipino Inventors Society and has been researching water treatment since his retirement in 1996. In 2006, the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines granted him an invention patent for his portable water treatment device.

The University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries (UP ISSI) and DANA Asia have teamed up to enhance the business model of the ALPAS Community Housing eco-store pilot project. On April 20, 2023, both organizations signed a partnership agreement at the Virata Hall in UP Diliman, Quezon City, to mark the beginning of this collaboration.

The agreement was signed by DANA Asia's Director of Programs, Ms. Lotti Fraser, on behalf of their CEO, Duncan Power, and UP ISSI Dir. Melanie M. Moraga-Leaño.

The signing was witnessed by key individuals who will be taking on critical roles in the intervention project. Among those present were Mr. Leo Alforte, who will be serving as DANA Asia's program coordinator, Mr. Reynold Ferdinand G. Manegdeg, who will act as the program adviser, Ms. Karen Kay C. Bravo-Coballes, who will serve as the project manager, and project management team members Mr. Joshua V. Garcia and Mr. Uziel Guthrie D. Naguit.

About the ALPAS Ecostore

The eco-store is situated at the Aniban ng Lehitimong Paninirahan ng Ligtas sa Sakuna (ALPAS) Community Housing Project in San Jose Del Monte City, Bulacan. It provides shelter for over 500 households that have been relocated from waterways and high-risk areas in Caloocan City.

On October 18, 2022, the community launched an eco-store venture with the assistance of DANA Asia, creating job opportunities for its members and advocating zero waste. The eco-store, which is operated and managed by the community cooperative, serves as a refilling station for household essentials like coffee, rice, and sugar.

By emphasizing the use of refillable containers, this initiative aims to significantly reduce plastic usage in the community and encourage residents to adopt more environmentally friendly consumption practices. Additionally, the store aims to provide more affordable yet high-quality products compared to those commonly found in sari-sari stores.

The UP ISSI and DANA Asia intervention program will be carried out in three phases. The first phase involves assessing the progress made by the pilot eco-store venture. In the second phase, the program team will propose strategic adjustments to the business model to ensure its sustainability. The last phase will provide a three-month mentorship program for ALPAS members operating the ecostore, equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge for continuous success.

The project management team will be conducting enterprise and community visits at ALPAS starting May 2023.

PASAY CITY - University Extension Specialist from the Institute for Small-Scale Industries of the University of the **Philippines** emphasized the impact of Honing Agents for National Disaster (HANDA) Program: Awareness Disaster Preparedness and Business Continuity Planning (BCP) for MSMEs in a panel discussion during the website and network launch event of the Women's

International Network on Disaster Risk Reduction – Philippines Chapter in the Director's Club, Mall of Asia last April 26.

Ms. Joanna Rose T. Laddaran, focal person of the HANDA program, shared that part of the course is equipping the micro, small, and medium enterprises with the knowledge and skills in conducting Business Continuity Planning.

"Our BCP program is guided by the MSME realities on the ground; in our study on the impacts of the COVID-19 on women in the informal economy, we found out that these women entrepreneurs faced multiple burdens," Laddaran explained.

She also added that during the pre-pandemic, they were already earning less than the living wage (250 a day) and during the pandemic, they suffered financially even more.

"As we train individuals coming from the MSME sector, they share their learning to their employees and co-workers, as well as their family members and their community; thus, we continuously develop a culture of resilience in the country," she said.



The panel also included chairperson Sandy Montano, Philippine Commission for Women, Atty. Violeta Seva, Earthquake and Mega cities Initiatives, Ms. Minet Jerusalem, Leyte Center for Development, Dr. Angela Zafra, Strategia Development Research Institute, Inc., Dr. Marqueza Reyes, Asian Institute of Management, Chairperson Rosemarie Rafael, Airspeed International Corporation, and Chief Superintendent Belinda Ochave.

Dr. Teresita Medado, President of Asia Pacific College and WIN DRR PH Convenor and Engr. Liza B. Silerio, ARISE Global Board Member and Vice President for Corporate Compliance Group, SM Supermalls delivered the opening remarks and welcome message respectively, while Sen. Loren Legarda served as the Keynote Speaker highlighting the laws and initiatives aligned with environmental preservation, waste management and disaster preparedness.

UP ISSI Gender and Development Committee focal person Jake A. Villanueva and Communities of Practice for Entrepreneurship (COPE) program manager Allyssa Anne Mari-De Guzman were invited to attend the event.

QUEZON CITY -University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries in partnership with the Business Continuity Managers Association of the Philippines, and the Women's International Network on Disaster Risk Reduction Philippines (WIN DRR PH) through the Communities of Practice for Entrepreneurship (COPE) program featured the Resilience Narratives of the Creative Industries through a webinar held last May 16, 2023, highlighting their efforts of adapting to the changes in the business landscape during the pandemic.

Direk Jhon Phil Hiro De Vera and Coach Rommel D. Kebek, both from Roshe Entertainment Productions (REP) and Roshe Performing Group (RPG), Robert Nelson V. Besana, Executive Director

for Multimedia Arts at Asia Pacific College, and Mr. Noel Gallon De Leon, publisher of Kasingkasing Press, were invited to highlight their experiences in the dance, creative and publishing industries respectively in line with the celebration of the Business Continuity Awareness Week.

Beats in the Dance Industry

RPG and REP founder Direk De Vera shared that their business struggled in various aspects especially on delivering their services to their clients.

"It has been the most difficult time for the dance industry most especially to my business because of the following: target market, access, delivery of service and availability of test kits and vaccine and funds," explained Direk De Vera on how the COVID-19 pandemic affected them.

He further elaborated that when the pandemic happened, they lost clients during live events, concerts, face-to-face events including coaching, daily sessions, and debuts which forced him to close his dance studio. This led them to having free workshops and advanced booking for their services.

In addition, Coach Kebek stated that because the dance industry was affected by the pandemic, having loyal contacts helped him in having private online dance classes which also provided income for his family.

"Zoom pa rin po or Google Meet pa rin po kami nagtuturo; actually sobrang hirap po kasi po imagine niyo po kausap ko po computer...mahirap po siya pero dahil kailangang lumaban, may anak ako at asawang kailangang providan, kinaya naman," he said.

Coach Kebek added that they survived by learning new skills like baking cakes and making chili garlic through the help of their manager and director.

Hues in the Multimedia Industry

On the other hand, Mr. Besana said that the pandemic has brought unprecedented changes that have affected their curriculum, facilities, and industry partnerships.

"When the pandemic hit, we had to adapt quickly to the new normal. Our faculty had to adjust to alternative teaching methods such as online classes, video conferencing and HyFlex learning," he stated.

He also shared that their students could not use their specialized equipment and that they needed to rely to their personal devices and software to complete their projects which compromised the quality of their output.

To continuously provide their services, Besana explained that they prepared and implemented a range of Business Continuity and Disaster Preparedness strategies which outlined the steps necessary to ensure the continuity of critical services in the event of a crisis or a disaster.

"We provide online platforms and tools to enable students and faculty to continue their academic activities even when they can't attend physical classes. We are also ensuring that our IT infrastructure is robust and capable of handling high volume of traffic so that there is no interruptions in online services," he said.

Pages of the Publishing Industry

To understand the development of the book industry, Mr. De Leon explained the importance of knowing the experiences of the small and independent presses with the hope that the viewers can also amplify their initiative or replicate it in their regions or communities.

"Because community is important to us, during this past pandemic, we introduced a new segment of the Iloilo Mega bookfair – the Sari-sari Bookstore sa Barangay – where we bring the books to the communities ourselves," he said.

He also added that they conduct storytelling sessions, and they help reading clinics on how they can start their curated library for children in their own barangay.

"In our experience here in Iloilo during the pandemic, we actually launched 40 ebooks, yung mga pre-pandemic books, ginawan namin ng version as e-books but of course, it was very challenging because our book industry ay hindi naman talaga handa sa digital kind of distribution," he also shared during the Question-and-Answer segment.

Furthermore, Dr. Teresita P. Medado, Convenor of Women's International Network for Disaster Risk Reduction (WIN DRR) and President of Asia Pacific College, and Mr. Keith S. Chan, President of Business Continuity Managers Association of the Philippines (BCMAP) and Vice President for Information Technology at Wilcon Depot, Inc. delivered their messages of resilience during the webinar.

Meanwhile, UP ISSI Director Melanie M. Moraga-Leaño stated in her opening remarks that with a sense of urgency, Business Continuity advocates have pushed to a higher level to call to equip the MSME sector the ability to prepare and implement business continuity plans.

"Resilience coupled with preparedness on Business Continuity can bring about positive changes for our entrepreneurs," said Dir. Moraga-Leaño.

UP ISSI at inaugural Digital Universities Asia event in Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia – Mr. Reynold Ferdinand Manegdeg, Head of the Business Enterprise Development Division at the University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries (UP ISSI), took center stage at the Times Higher Education's inaugural (THE) Digital Universities Asia (DUASIA) event held from May 9 to 10, 2023, at the Hilton Kuala Lumpur, in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The event brought together higher education, industry, and policy leaders to explore the future of digital-first higher education in Asia.

Under the theme "Smart innovation for lifelong education," the event showcased the latest technologies set to transform universities and featured interactive panels, live demonstrations, workshops, and networking opportunities. The event's agenda explored strategies for universities to leverage "inclusive business" practices as a solution to bridge the digital divide and mitigate inequality in Asia.

In his presentation during the 2nd day of the event, Mr. Manegdeg shared the results of a UP ISSI research project titled "A Study on the Challenges of the Relationship Among Coffee Enterprises in Atok, Benguet." This 2019 study comprehensively analyzed the dynamics between small and large enterprises, including the potential challenges and benefits inherent in such partnerships, in the context of inclusivity.

According to Mr. Manegdeg, the study revealed that the effectiveness and sustainability of inclusive business (IB) models should not be evaluated solely on inclusivity.

Instead, it should also consider business competitiveness and equity provision, ensuring that all parties involved benefit equally from the arrangement.

He emphasized the importance of fostering a thriving ecosystem that supports smaller or marginalized groups in a sustainable IB model. He called for clear definitions of each stakeholder's role and urged the government and academia to focus on enabling this ecosystem rather than regulating or creating a rigid system that may hinder the natural dynamism among enterprises.

Finding the right balance of incentives was also highlighted in Manegdeg's talk, as he stressed the need for governments to provide incentives for larger businesses that are willing to sacrifice productivity to include the marginalized sector.

Lastly, Manegdeg called for more case studies on the relationship between small and large enterprises to determine the most effective way to promote the welfare of the marginalized sector.

The inaugural DUASIA event provided a platform for sharing best practices and innovative solutions to shape the future of higher education in Asia. Manegdeg's insights into sustainable IB models and the importance of supporting marginalized groups contributed to a broader discourse on the crucial role of the academe in promoting the growth of micro, small, and medium enterprises.

UP ISSI in APO-DAP Workshop on Nurturing Social Enterprises



The University of the Philippines Institute for Small-Scale Industries (UP ISSI), represented by Ms. Melanie V. Cabotaje, took part in the workshop, "Nurturing Social Enterprises" sponsored by the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) and implemented by the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP).


The Workshop aimed to: (a) Promote social enterprises and social innovation in the service industry; and for the participants to: (b) Understand the key factors for developing social organizations; and (c) Gain insight into current social issues, how to devise solutions, and how to measure the impact of social enterprises. The Workshop was held on December 6–8, 2021, from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM (Manila Time) via virtual sessions. There were 31 participants from 13 countries.

The three-day Workshop was divided into nine sessions; three sessions each day.

Chien-Wen Professor Dr. Shen, of **Business** Administration at the National Central University Republic of China, introduced the concept of social entrepreneurship in the first session. He emphasized the crucial role of social entrepreneurs in making an impact in our society and creating solutions to social issues and problems. The second session was a case study of a social enterprise in Indonesia, Aruna, which aims to provide better market access and fairer trading opportunities for the fishermen and buyers, while streamlining the administrative and financial paperwork involved in exporting seafood. Ms. Utari Octavianty, General Director of Aruna, shared that Aruna's technology bypasses the numerous tengkulak, or middlemen, that span the local, provincial, interislands, and overseas levels, resulting in a more efficient and profitable business operation for the local fishermen. The third session was another case study of the Social Entrepreneur College Inc. (SEC), which aims to promote social entrepreneurship in Japan by raising and developing social entrepreneurs. Mr. Hideyuki Ezaki, President of Management Assistance Co., Ltd. in Japan, shared how this social enterprise supports over 100 businesses through productivity improvement, overseas marketing, business planning, new service creation, among others.

The second day opened with Mr. Wan Song, CEO of Bookband Co., Ltd. Republic of Korea, sharing the story of RZ Manna, a social enterprise in Rwanda, East Africa. RZ Manna is a bakery established by a group of young people from South Korea in an aim to create jobs for unemployed youths. The speaker emphasized the need for ground work before establishing a social enterprise, i.e. conducting market research, developing a business plan, testing different strategies, among others. Dr. Chien-Wen Shen in Session 5 explained how social enterprises can receive funding through diverse sources, while exploring different organizational forms and measuring social impact. In Session 6, Mr. Hideyuki Ezaki talked about a recycling business in Japan. Citing this social enterprise's experience, his presentation focused more on the process of establishing and operating a social enterprise, emphasizing the importance of: loving and believing in your business idea, keeping the

business concept simple, identifying the societal problem your social enterprise will address and being pro-active about it, going through the proper business management process – i.e. conducting financial analysis and feasibility study.

The third and last day of the workshop started with the discussion of Dr. Chien-Wen Shen on the various criticisms being hurled against social entrepreneurship and social entrepreneurs, as well as the challenges and opportunities surrounding this field. He shared that some social enterprises focus too narrowly on the issues or facts that fit their agenda. He added that others criticize the methodology of a

social enterprise, even if they agree with its goals. Some of the opportunities the speaker identified were: increasing government support on social entrepreneurship and social enterprises, growing corporate social responsibility and the integration of social and market logics. In Session 8, Ms. SungUn Chang, Founder and Chief Executive Officer of YOLK – Republic of Korea, shared the story of YOLK Solar Cow. To improve access to electricity and education in Kenya and Tanzania, the program has designed solar charging system that literally looks like a cow. Placed near schools, the solar cow has "power milk"—white, portable batteries—that students can take home to their families. The students attend classes while they charge their batteries using the solar cow. After school, they can each take their own batteries which they can use to light their homes in the evening. In this session, the speaker emphasized the crucial role of technology and innovation in addressing some of the most common problems in our society. In the last session, Mr. Hideyuki Ezaki introduced the SOFIPA (Sociedad Financiera del Pacífico) – a social enterprise in the form of a microfinance institution (MFI) in Mexico.

SOFIPA offers financial support – credit and savings products – to small entrepreneurs in central west part of Mexico, which are mostly unattended by commercial banks and other MFIs in the country. SOFIPA serves rural women living in remote suburban and rural areas in the poorest states of Mexico.

The workshop ended with the participants sharing their learnings and insights. Ms. Cabotaje shared:

"The workshop provided generous space for social entrepreneurs from different countries and from various industries to discuss about their experiences, challenges and opportunities in building and managing their own social enterprises. Listening to different social entrepreneurs talk about their reflections and perspectives about social entrepreneurship and how their social enterprises are making an impact in their society is a huge learning experience for me."




Open House Mentoring and Learning Session
